

Here's the official scoop on tracking...!

Our lush pasture grass that looked great the end of March was cut and is being baled in the next few days. We were holding out hope that those 200 acres would stay usable thru the trial but we knew it was a possibility it wouldn't work out with the weather.

We are officially going to have the trial on alfalfa. The alfalfa is 1st year alfalfa so it's soft enough to walk on barefoot per the farmer. It was cut last Thursday/Friday so there will be some growth but it's between 6-10 inches tall.

We have a total of 144 acres for use for the trial and are working on securing practice Alfalfa for tracking although practice tracking may be outside of the Galt area. We will update with information on that as soon as we have it.

I spent over an hour with the farmer today checking terrain and hazards on each parcel. There is absolutely no pesticides, Lyme, foxtails, or stinging nettle. All 144 acres is the same Age and growth so it's as consistent as you can get with tracking conditions for this number of dogs. This is clean crop and she will try and work the watering schedule so there is good moisture in the soil.
